Holden Manz Cabernet Sauvignon 2016

Very big on the palate with rich entry of ripe red ripe berry fruits. The middle palate is focussed and shows width with complexity and depth leading to a full dry finish. Tannins are present and balanced combining well with the flavours of the sappy black fruit. £25

Holden Manz Shiraz 2013 £25

Clean and subtle on entry, showing ripe, soft tannins with beautiful stewed fruits and spicy flavours. Inviting strawberries and raspberries provide a long lingering finish.

Holden Manz Big G £39

This wine demonstrates an explosion of berry fruits and soft ripe tannins creating a wonderfully balanced blend. Cabernet Franc, with its rich intensity of black fruit flavour and acid, combined with the balanced tannins and depth of fruit in the Cabernet Sauvignon results in a deeply complex and unique wine.

Merlust Rubicon £36

Merlust Estate has been the pride of the Myburgh family since 1756. The name Merlust means 'pleasure of the sea', as the property is situated 5km from False Bay (and 15km south of Stellenbosch), where the cooling influence of the coast allows the grapes ripen slowly. In 1980, after several years of experimentation together with winemaker Giorgio Dalla Cia, he announced the birth of the new blend. With proportions of 70% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc, a new style of wine had been created in South Africa. The pair had crossed a new frontier, making an innovative step towards shaping the South African production of today.
